Risk of Bushfire

Background

Work that occurs off campus such as fieldwork may occur in bushfire prone areas. Bushfire risk and emergency planning should be considered when planning work activities.

The <u>Australasian Fire Authorities Council (AFAC)</u> are predicting an increased risk of significant bushfires occurring in Australia over the coming Spring/Summer seasons. This increased risk exists across multiple Australian states and territories.




Figure 1 Seasonal Bushfire Outlook Spring 2023. Areas are based on the interim biogeographic regionalisation for Australia and other geographical features.

Issues to Consider

KEY:

Consider the following when planning fieldwork activity:

- What tasks are you performing? Could these increase the risk of fire?
- What is the fire load in the area you are visiting? Is the area well maintained with fire breaks?
- What is the current fire rating in the area you are visiting?
- Do you have an evacuation route planned?
- What is the weather like for the time you are visiting? Ensure that you regularly review the emergency warnings and fire danger information for the areas you plan to visit.
- What communication systems are available if the mobile phone network is disrupted due to a bushfire?
- Could asthma or other respiratory conditions be triggered?

Activities which may potentially cause a bushfire **must not occur when there is an increased risk of bushfires**.
