2023 Application Guidelines

Instructions

Value: \$3000

Eligibility: All Professional and Academic staff, as individuals or teams. Self-nominations will be accepted for the Reconciliation Award.

The Reconciliation Award recognises individuals and teams for their significant contributions to promoting reconciliation, through exceptional practices or by implementing initiatives which support the deliverables of UQ's Reconciliation Action Plan.

Applicants should demonstrate one or more of the following:

- Implementation or active engagement with an innovative project, program or activity, which engages HaBS staff, students and/or the community to foster greater respect, understanding and appreciation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, histories, languages, achievements and/or cultural protocols.
- Implementation or active engagement with initiatives that promote or strengthen opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, organisations and communities within HaBS, the health sector, or the higher education sector.
- Significant contribution to reviewing and establishing more culturally appropriate research systems and/or inclusive curriculum and teaching practices.
- Significant contribution to building strong, mutually beneficial relationships between Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous students, staff, communities, organisations and partners at HaBS.

When an agency, group or organisation external to UQ is mentioned in the application, the applicant/s are required to provide a brief signed letter of support to endorse the award submission.
