

## Queensland Health Orientation Guide

The Queensland Health orientation is mandatory, and requires you to read and understand all of the policies and frameworks outlined on the [Preparing for your clinical placement](#) website. This website contains important information on QH policies on:

- › Blue card and criminal history checks
- › Code of conduct
- › National Code of Conduct for Health Care Workers (Queensland)
- › Cultural Diversity
- › Immunisation and infection prevention
- › Workplace Health and Safety
- › Privacy, confidentiality and documentation

To certify that you have read and understood the requirements, prior to commencing placement Queensland Health requires that you:

- 1) Sign and return the *Student Orientation Checklist*
- 2) Sign and return the *Group A Student Deed Poll*
- 3) Complete the [iLearn@QHealth](#) training modules

You are required to return the Deed Poll and Checklist to your School.

Do not submit your certificates to your School, but file them safely. You must ensure you take these certificates and your QH Evidence Record with you to any orientation that occurs and on your first day of placement. You may be sent home from placement if you are unable to present these documents.

### Student Deed Poll

You are required to read the *Group A Student Deed Poll*. On the first page complete the University's details as follows:

University of Queensland (ABN 63 942 912 684 ) (“Education Provider”)

On the last page, print your full name, then sign and date the form in front of a witness. A witness does not have to be a Justice of the Peace or a UQ staff member, but the person must not be related to you. The witness must print their full name and sign the form.
